2023 SURE Program Requirements and Acknowledgements*

- SURE applicants must be full-time undergraduate students in the College of Arts and Sciences (research advisor may be from another UNE college).
- SURE participants must be in good academic standing following the completion of the preceding spring semester (for summer 2023, by the end of the spring 2023 semester).
- SURE participants must be in residence (i.e., on-campus or at an approved field site) for the duration of their SURE award. SURE participants may not work on their research from a remote location.
- The SURE program runs from May 22-August 11th. SURE participants may not start earlier or work later than these dates. No exceptions will be made and any hours worked outside of these dates will be charged to the research advisor's department.
- The SURE program pay rate is \$13.80/hour.
- SURE recipients are eligible for a \$200 materials stipend.
- The SURE program is considered full-time (40 hours per week) and participants are expected to work 40 hours per week. Overtime (> 40 hours in a week) is not allowed. SURE participants may not work at other UNE positions during their approved SURE period.
- SURE participants are required to complete necessary training modules and HR paperwork within 3 days of start date. SURE participants are also required to adhere to the COVID safety protocols outlined in UNE Onward.
- SURE participants are required to present at the designated research symposium.
- SURE participants are required to prepare a short final report outlining the outcomes and results of their summer project.
- SURE participants are required to submit bi-weekly timesheets to their research advisor or school administrative assistant for approval. All SURE timesheets must be turned in by August 31, 2023, to be paid by the College of Arts and Sciences.
- Details about any program activities will be sent to participants as they become available. Note that summer 2023 on-campus housing rates will be finalized in the spring. Summer 2022 rates are listed here.

*Note: while the term "research" is used, please note that students from all CAS majors are encouraged to apply and projects spanning the areas of research, scholarship, and creative activity (RSCA) are welcome.
